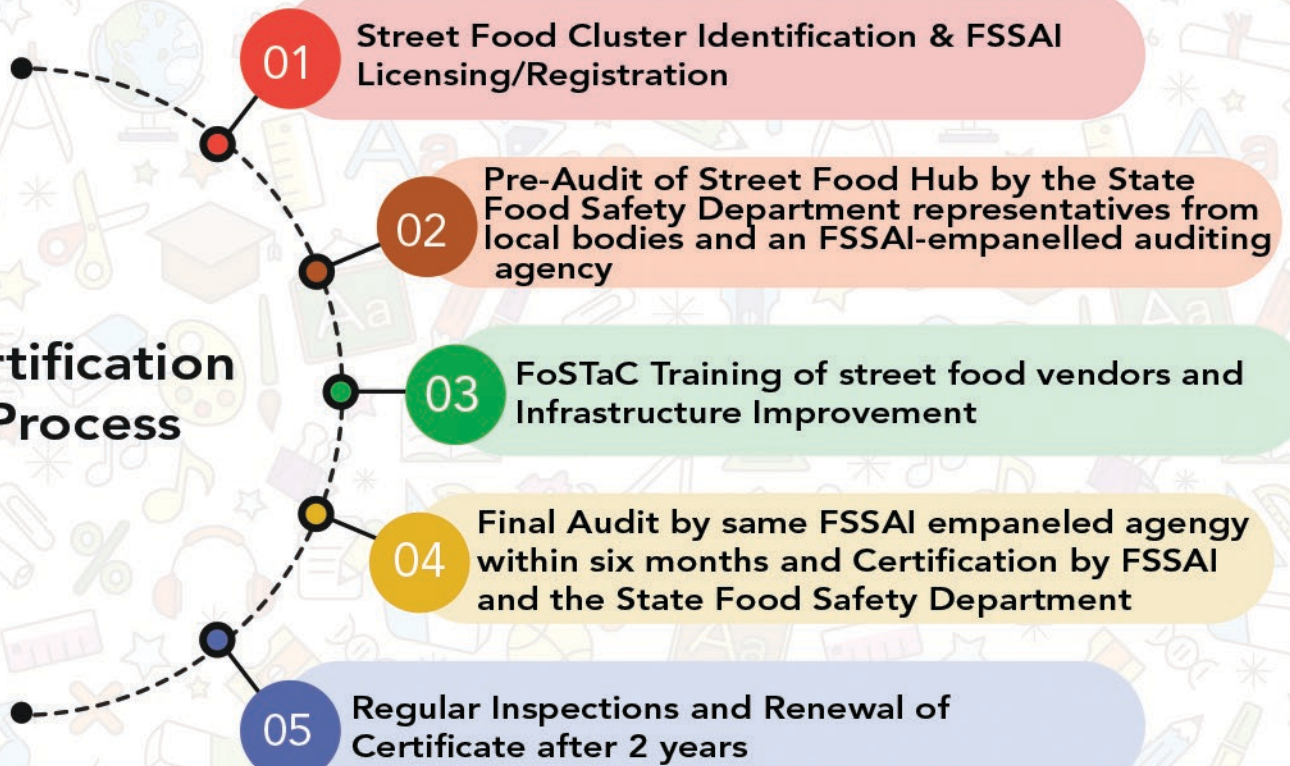




The Clean Street Food Hub initiative aims to improve hygiene and sanitation standards of street food hubs or clusters of vendors/shops/stalls selling popular street foods largely comprising local and regional cuisines. This initiative certifies street food hubs based on pre-defined benchmarks as per Schedule 4 requirements of the Food Safety and Standards (FSS) Act, 2006. Ultimately, it aims to build trust among consumers about enjoying safe and hygienic local eating experiences.
